Grace Notes Hymn Festival

Next Sunday, February 12 at 4:00 P.M., FUMC will host a Hymn Festival led by Dr. Timothy Albrecht, Music Professor and University Organist of Candler School of Theology at Emory University. Dr. Albrecht will lead the festival from the organ console and will offer three organ solos on the church's Schantz Pipe Organ.

Hymns from the church year will be sung---some familiar---some unfamiliar: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost, Reformation, Christ the King, and Thanksgiving will be observed through hymns, psalms, scripture, and other readings. Choristers from Main Street United Methodist Church, Dillon and Ebenezer United Methodist Church, Longs and St. Paul's Waccamaw United Methodist Church, Pawley's Island will join our chancel choir to lead the congregational singing. Here is a bit of the Wesley Family Tree...

Rev. Samuel Wesley was an English minister, poet and hymnist. His ministry was not particularly fulfilling to him nor to his parish, and most of his writings were burned in the fire at the Epworth parsonage that nearly took John Wesley's life. Samuel was married to Susannah Annesley Wesley (a minister's daughter) who is remembered for her rich ministry in the parish, and her writings of meditations and scriptural commentaries.

Samuel not only married a minister's daughter, his own father was a minister, as were both of his grandfathers; and his great, great grandfather was the Anglican Bishop of Armagh (the Bishop of Ireland).

Samuel and Susannah had nineteen children, of whom nine died in their infancy. Of the ten who survived, three boys and seven girls – all three of the sons - Samuel, John and Charles - became ministers. The two younger sons, John and Charles, are considered the founders of the Methodist movement.

Rev. John (Benjamin) Wesley was a noted preacher, prolific scholar, and writer and translator of hymns. He married at age forty-eight, but had neither a happy marriage nor any children. However, at his death he left behind 135,000 members and 541 itinerant preachers known as "Methodists."

Rev. Charles Wesley was a prolific hymnist. Of more than 8,000 hymns that he wrote, 6,000 were published in his lifetime.

Charles Wesley's musical genius was continued through his two sons – Charles, Jr. and Samuel – and a grandson – Samuel Sebastian Wesley. All three were well known organists and composers. Son, Samuel and grandson, Samuel Sebastian were especially well regarded. Samuel was called by some "the English Mozart," and Samuel Sebastian was considered one of the leading organists and choirmasters in England in his lifetime.

Our current hymnal contains works by four generations of the Wesley family – Samuel, John and Charles, Samuel, and Samuel Sebastian.
