American Experience

Our nation and our denomination embrace a wide variety of people, cultures and styles of expression. The hymn selection today reflects the inclusive spirit of the American Experience.

Our first hymn, *To God Be the Glory*, was written by Fanny Crosby, a nineteenth century Gospel hymn writer. Crosby was clearly the most prolific hymn writer to come out of the Methodist Church. (You will remember that Charles Wesley never left the Anglican Church.) Although many of Fanny Crosby's hymns were very popular during her lifetime, *To God Be the Glory* was not well known in the United States until some years after her death. During Billy Graham's 1954 London Crusade someone gave Cliff Barrows a copy of the song. Barrows had heard the song on a previous visit to England and included it in the Crusade. It received such an enthusiastic response in London that Graham and Barrows continued using the song and introduced it to U. S. audiences in their Nashville Crusade later that same year.

Our second hymn, *Lord, You have come to the Lakeshore*, reflects the growing Hispanic influence in our church and nation. Interestingly, this popular new hymn is sung to several different English translations.

Our closing hymn, *God of Grace and God of Glory*, was written in 1930 for the first worship service held in New York's Riverside Church by the pastor, Harry Emerson Fosdick. Fosdick, an ordained Baptist minister, was a noted liberal preacher and writer. Although the hymn originally addressed the anxiety of America during the Great Depression, its timeless expression of faith has kept it relevant and made it a favorite hymn of many.
