Where is God when you need God?

The book of Esther holds the distinction of being the only book in the entire Bible that does not specifically mention God. That has led believers and unbelievers alike, to ask the question, "Is God there?"

For those who read the Holy Scriptures with eyes of faith, who hear the Word of God read with the ears of faith, who receive the witness of God with hearts of faith; the answer seems obvious! "Of course God is in Esther!" In our reading the Bible, we have already come across a number of stories which are indirectly referenced in the book of Esther.

This morning we will recall those stories together, and explore the message of the book of Esther for people of every age and time.
