
Traveling This Fall? Missing Sunday Worship?



After hearing the stories from the FUMC members who have traveled to Haiti to be in mission with the children, Ben Chanaca, the 10 year old son of Mark and Jenny, wanted to do something to help. Their experiences left him with a lasting impression. Ben said he kept thinking about the lack of food and the conditions the children of Haiti live in, the pictures of the boards they slept on for beds, hearing about the mud cookies they ate, and decided he wanted to try and raise money to send to Haiti. It was difficult for him to wrap his mind around the fact that there are many children in this world who go without what we take for granted as a basic necessity. Ben found inspiration for what he was doing from those who went and had come back to share.

Ben played golf with his grandfather weekly this past summer and collected 3 full bags of lost golf balls. He came to his parents and Grandfather with an idea he had concerning a fundraiser for Haiti.



Ben was given permission from the Director of Golf at the

Hackler course, Mr. Charles Johns, to set up at the cabana on the 1st Tee to sell the balls. He sorted and cleaned more than 200 balls to find and prepare the best ones. Ben typed up information about the needs of the children and families of Haiti and what he planned to do. He was able to spend time on one of the busiest days greeting, meeting, and speaking to golfers about the ongoing Haiti mission at our church and how much a \$10 donation would do in providing food for a family of 4 for a week. He offered free golf balls in exchange for a donation to the Haiti mission. Ben has been overwhelmed and touched by the outpouring of support that he received and how golfers graciously took time to stop and allow him to share with them. Some gave and took balls while others just generously gave a donation. Ben successfully raised \$252!

This is one of many examples of the ways that each of us can find a way to support the many missions—locally and abroad that FUMC participates. Way to go Ben!!
