Three Tips for Reading Revelation

Scripture was not given to us to keep to ourselves. It is a magnificent tool for sharing the word and love of God in a hurting and searching world. Some passages in the Bible make it easy - when someone asks "How are you today?" you might answer with Psalm 118:24 providing an opportunity to witness about God's blessings in our lives. Or if someone says, "Football isn't what it used to be..." you might respond by saying "It hasn't been the same since the John 3:16 guy totally flipped out." Providing the opportunity for further talk of God's love, or how those who focus on the "end of the world" frequently lose touch with today - and by the way, we're studying Revelation at our church...

I admit that talking with others about Revelation can be tricky. So here are three tips...

Take advantage of this opportunity to become informed - Many people are hesitant to have substantive conversations about Revelation because they are not well informed. Take advantage of the literature available to supplement your study, regularly participate in Worship, Sunday School and Bible studies. And feel free to call or email and ask questions.

Find and share favorite passages in Revelation - Here is one from the reading this week: "Listen! I am standing at the door, knocking; if you hear my voice and open the door, I will come in to you and eat with you, and you with me." (Rev. 3:20). You might tell a friend, "I read the greatest thing this week in Revelation..."

Don't argue or debate - There is a view of Revelation called Dispensationalism that is taught by a small minority of Christians. Unfortunately it is taught by several popular TV preachers. Rather than argue or debate with those who hold this deviant teaching, find common ground. Scripture should draw Christians together, not divide them. Agree to disagree and then talk about the "good news" in Revelation.

Mark Twain said "It is better to keep your mouth closed and let people think you are a fool than to open it and remove all doubt." But how much better still, to become informed and share the word of God with those who hunger for his love!
